Our Story

Sajdah's purpose is to give every Muslim a chance to learn how to pray correctly, and to make praying a fulfilling spiritual experience.

Like it was for most Muslims worldwide, 15 March 2019 was an extremely shocking day for Abdulrahman Saleh Khamis. He woke up to the tragic news of the massacre in a mosque in Christchurch, New Zealand, that claimed the lives of 51 innocent worshipers gathered to offer prayer.

The incident left him devastated, but he saw a silver lining in it. This tragedy shifted public opinion in favour of Islam, and people started to convert in good numbers after realizing Islam's eternal message of peace.

Being an electrical and computer engineer, Khamis saw this as an opportunity to pay tribute to those who lost their lives that day. He decided to come up with something that would make offering Salah easier for new Muslims, and children in particular.

After the Kalima Shahadah, the most fundamental pillar of Islam is Salah, which is the direct link between an individual and Allah. But new Muslims find it difficult to learn the correct postures of Salah and recite the Qur'an verses. Parents also often have difficulties teaching their children how to offer prayer properly and recite the Qur'an.

Our Story

Using all of his knowledge and skills, Khamis found an innovative solution, now known as Sajdah. This praying rug is integrated with technology, a smartphone app, and features a smart screen that works like a prompter for the worshipers.

One gets closest to Allah while offering sajdah (prostration) during prayer and the idea behind creating Sajdah is to help everyone have that fulfilling spiritual experience during prayer.

Sajdah aims to help worshippers learn how to perform ruku (bowing), sujood (prostration), and qiyam (standing) without forgetting the Qur'an verses and supplication.

The Qur'an reveals the message of Allah, and while performing salah, when we recite the Qur'an, its verses go directly to our hearts as if Allah was addressing us. Sajdah makes this practice a soulful experience for all Muslims and allows a worshiper to choose any surah of the Qur'an to recite during the salah. With the help of Sajdah, one can recite the whole Qur'an while praying.

The smart rug teaches the mandatory prayers and guides, worshippers, to offer 25+ types of prayers, including Eid, Tarawih, Qiyam, and Tahajjud (Night Prayer).

The pain of 15 March 2019 hasn't disappeared from the heart of Khamis, but he believes that by helping people learn how to pray accurately and recite the Qur'an, he keeps their memory alive forever through Sajdah.

Award & Recognition

Abdurrahman's true dedication and commitment towards innovation and creating something that would be greatly helpful for Muslims inspired him to invent Sajdah. However, hatching an idea in your brain is one thing, while bringing it to reality is another.

It was the sheer dedication of Abdurehman to the project from Sep. to Nov. 2019 that turned the innovative concept of Sajdah into a reality. He unveiled the prototype of Sajdah at the 11th season of the Stars of Science competition, which is an edutainment TV show - an initiative of the Qatar Foundation. The show empowers Arab innovators to develop technological solutions for their communities, benefitting people's health and lifestyles, and helping to preserve the environment.

Abdurrahman was thrilled to share the stage with many bright minds, but winning the third prize and a great deal of appreciation and encouragement for his invention was an overwhelming experience for him.

Abdurrahman met with Abdul Ali in a Startup Demo Day event in Qatar Science and Technology Park, where they both discussed the idea

in detail and agreed to make Sajdah a reality and take it to the marketplace.

He incorporated the company on May 3 2020, with co-founder and Chief Growth Officer Abdul Ali.

Design for manufacturability (DFM) Prototyping was successfully completed in Jan. 2021

Customer surveys and feedback was collected, new features were added; such as the 45° LED stand, improved comfort with a memory foam layer, an anti-slip layer, intelligent control with smartphones, the Apple watch, etc.

Thakaa Technology launched the Sajdah mobile app in March 2012, focusing on prayer guides and times. Today, the app is available for download free of charge in the Apple App Store and the Google Play Store. The Sajdah App provides helpful, step-by-step prayer guides in English & Arabic. The app also offers an ad-free experience with privacy & data protection features.

Symbols & Meanings

Parts that make up the Sajdah Company icon.



Prayer

The daily obligatory prayers collectively form the second of the five pillars in Islam, observed five times every day at prescribed times. Prayers are recited in the Arabic language.



Circuitry

The complete path or combination of interconnected paths for the electron flow in a computer. A computer's speed of operation depends on the design of its circuitry.



Mosque Dome

Most mosques feature one or more domes, called 'qubba' in Arabic. While it is not a ritual requirement like the mihrab, a dome does possess significance within the mosque.

The Primary Logo

Our logo is the most critical and recognizable element of our brand. It is modern yet simple, symbolizing the Islamic prayer, complex circuitry and the dome of the mosque.



White & Color Versions

The full logo, featuring both the icon and the wordmark should be used whenever possible to officially represent the company. This can be used in:

- 1. Full color on white
- 2. White on color
- 3. Color versions on our primary colors



Minimum & Recommended Sizes

The Sajdah logo should never be smaller than .5 inches or 36 px. The recommended size for our logo is 1 inch or 72 px.






Exclusion Zone

It is important that the **Sajdah** logo remains perfectly legible and free from obstructions.

Clear space: To ensure the logo is free of any visually distracting elements, a minimum clear space of .5 in. or 36px. has been defined. The noted clear space changes proportionally in relation to the height of the logo.



Logo Usage

Incorrect usage of the logo:

- 1. Do not apply shadows, gradients or other effects.
- 2. Do not apply colors.
- 3. Do not use only the icon.
- 4. Do not change the arrangement of the logo.
- 5. Do not stretch or alter the proportions of the logo.












